Field Engineer

Main Goal

To assist project staff to ensure all trade-craft work is planned, scheduled, understood, and put in place consistent with the approved project schedule and project documents. The goal of this position is to build a fundamental understanding of the trade work and to ultimately grow into a Project Superintendent role.

Responsibilities, Authorities, and Key Result Areas

- Provide support to the project staff required for the execution of the work and assist with the resolution of field problems, as necessary.
- Assist the project staff in developing and maintaining as-built drawings and other work tasks and assist with or reviews submittals, change orders, RFI's, and budget forecasting.
- Assist with the development and implementation of weekly short interval schedules. Monitor and maintain schedule activities to ensure project stays on schedule.
- Assist with providing daily project documentation through Daily Reports, pictures, etc.
- Perform elements of the processes involved in budgeting and controlling costs so that the project can be completed within the approved budget.
- Assist in the implementation of the site safety program as required and ensure subcontractor compliance with HCCI safety standards and all applicable safety codes and regulations.
- Review all work as it is being placed to be sure it is installed within accepted tolerances.
- Review contract drawings, specifications, and shop drawings to ensure proper coordination and installation.
- Other duties, as assigned.
